Abstract

This study aimed to determine the level of survival among workers of the tourism industry amidst the pandemic when classified according to according to the type of industry, monthly income, and civil status in which the researchers utilized the descriptive-survey method to gather data and investigate the significant difference and relationship. Fifty respondents were selected through simple random sampling method. Statistical tools employed were mean, standard deviation, percentage frequency distribution, t – test, and ANOVA. The findings of this study states that there was no significant difference in the level of survival among workers of the tourism industry amidst pandemic when grouped according to type of industry, monthly income, and status. The results showed, however, that significant difference existed when it comes to the monthly income of the workers. This means that the higher income earners have higher level of survival compared to low the income earners.
