Abstract

This investigation sought to ascertain the perceived effects of smoking among third year CSM students of JBLFMU - Molo. There were 43 randomly selected cruise Ship management students of JBLFMU - Molo who served as respondents of the study. The dependent variables were the perceived effects of smoking among third year CSM students. Gender and monthly income were the independent variables. Means, standard deviations, t-test for independent samples and Pearsons' r were used to interpret the data gathered. The 0.05 level of criterion on the acceptance or rejection of the null hypothesis was used. Results showed that there is no significant relationship in the perceived effects of smoking among third year CSM students when grouped according to gender and monthly income of parents.
