STUDENTS' PREFERRED LEARNING MODALITY DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

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Abstract

In this present time, education is a need for the youth because it is the best way to become a better individual and help them succeed with their future career. We are all accustomed to the traditional way of learning by going to school 5-6 times a week and spend 8 hours in school where teachers and students can be found inside the four corners of the classroom. The researchers conducted this study to know the students' preferred learning modality during the pandemic. This study determined the preferred learning modality of JBLFMU-Molo students when grouped according to gender and degree program. Stratified guota-sampling was utilized to get random 100 BSTM students and 100 BSCSM students of JBLFMU-Molo. Results revealed that online learning is less preferred by students, while traditional learning is more preferred. Second-year students moderately prefer online class, the same for the third-year students, while traditional learning is very highly preferred, and the third-year students highly prefer it. Given the gathered data and results, the researchers can now conclude that online class is also efficient in learning, but traditional learning is far more different. that's why students would still prefer it.

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
