Abstract

This study aimed to determine the impact of Covid-19 pandemic as perceived by the graduates of John B. Lacson Foundation Maritime University - Molo, Inc. This study was conducted during the first semester of Academic Year 2020-2021 at John B. Lacson Foundation Maritime University-Molo, Inc. The participants of this study were the Forty-four (44) randomly selected graduates of John B. Lacson Foundation Maritime University - Molo, Inc. graduated last Academic Year 2018. To come up with the data needed, the researchers made a checklist questionnaire, which was used as an instrument to collect the data from the respondents. The results revealed that the impact of Covid-19 pandemic as perceived by the graduates of John B. Lacson Foundation Maritime University-Molo, Inc. Iloilo City when taken as an entire group is "moderate." When grouped according to sex, course, and location, the male graduates experienced a "major" impact, while the female graduates experienced a "moderate" impact. Moreover, BSCSM, BSCA, and BSMAR-E graduates experienced a "moderate" impact, while the BSBA graduates experienced a "minor" impact and BSTM graduates experienced a "major" impact, respectively. The graduates, regardless of income, have the same "moderate" impacts towards Covid-19 pandemic.
