## Abstract

This study was initiated to determine the Cruise Ship Management Students' Awareness of the Supreme Student Council at John B. Lacson Colleges Foundation - Molo, Inc. respondents of this study were the one hundred (100) Cruise Ship Management students. They were chosen through random sampling. This study used the questionnaire - checklist that served as an instrument to gather the needed data. The variables in the study were the age, gender, and year - level as the independent variables, and awareness of the Cruise Ship Management Students as dependent variable. The following were the statistical tools employed: category of age and gender were subjected to t - test, while the category of year - level was subjected to Analysis of Variance or ANOVA. The treatment mentioned showed the following findings: (1) The respondents' average age was 18.9, most were female, unmarried, and under intermediate level of education, (2) The study showed that the level of awareness of all the Cruise Ship Management students of the Supreme Student Council was "average" (3) The study showed further that the level of awareness of the male and

female Cruise Ship Management students towards the Supreme Student Council has "insignificant" difference, and finally, (4) The study revealed that the level of awareness of the Cruise Ship Management Students, aged 16 through 18, on the Student Supreme Council, and the level of awareness of the Cruise Ship Management Students, aged 19 through 21, on the Supreme Student Council showed "insignificant" differences.
