## **Abstract**

This study determined the work preference of the graduating students of Bachelor of Science in Cruise Ship Management at John B. Lacson Foundation Maritime University (Molo). The respondents of this survey were 152 BSCSM students who were classified according to gender and section. The study employed the descriptive research design. Results revealed the following: (1) the most preferred work preference in terms of department was the F & B Department, followed by the Housekeeping Department, and the Front Office Department; Work preference according to gender and section was sea-based; (2) In terms of gender, both male and female preferred sea-based; (3) In terms of section, students from Sections Alpha, Charlie, and Delta preferred sea-based. While those students from Section Bravo had the majority who preferred land-based jobs; (4) When the students were asked about their work preferences, majority of those who preferred the F & B Department stated that "baking is my passion, "sharing talent not only for the country but also in other countries." Others say, "This is where I am good at." "I want to develop my skills and gain more ideas;" (5) most of the male students preferred to work sea-based.
